The Housing and Redevelopment Authority of Hibbing (HRA) encourages the public to attend a public hearing on the Moving to Work (MTW) Supplement. This MTW Supplement details proposed policies that will affect HRA Section 9 Public Housing residents.

(3115 7th Ave E, Hibbing, Minnesota 55746)**

The purpose of the hearing is to inform the public about the MTW Supplement and receive public comments on the proposed policies. The HRA is proposing five new policies to encourage and assist residents in reaching economic self-sufficiency: a stepped rent schedule, less frequent income reexaminations, an educational program, a modified work requirement and term limits on nonelderly and nondisabled residents.

An additional hearing on the proposed Work Requirement will take place immediately after the conclusion of the MTW Supplement Hearing at the same location.

All relevant documents and other pertinent information, as well as written views received from local, state, and federal agencies, will be available for public inspection and copying. Public comments will be received either written or verbally by a recorder, and will become part of the official public hearing record. The comments will be considered before final submission of the MTW Supplement to HUD.
